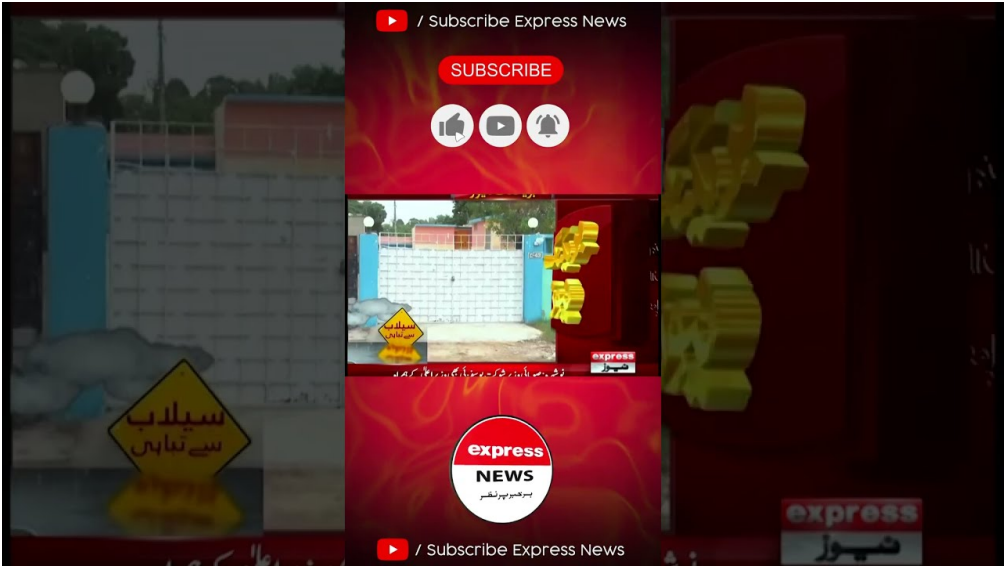
While parental involvement is also valued in traditional schools, it usually revolves around attending events or supporting homework assignments rather than integrating home learning experiences into school activities.
